intervention in public space in collaboration with Fawzy Emrany

27 May 2007 — Jabal Amman, Amman, JOR — No Condition is Permanent, a project on art in public space by Rayelle Niemann — Duration: 6 hours

Background — Since 8500 BC, Amman has been home to various civilizations. In the 13th century, the city was named Philadelphia by the Hellenic ruler of Egypt. In 1921, the founder of the Hashemite dynasty declared Amman the capital city of his kingdom. The city, built on seven hills, quickly developed into a financial and trade center of the Middle East. Today, Amman is in a state of upheaval. Old buildings are being torn down; existing social and economic infrastructures are breaking apart. The Gulf States are investing in the real estate sector; property and rental prices are rising rapidly. Since the Iraq War, approximately 1 million people have fled to Jordan, some illegally.

Setting — In the district of Jabal Amman, X, Y, and Fawzy Emrany discover an old stone house that has been empty for a long time. Its owner is not known. On the opposite hill, in the district of Luweibdeh, is the independent art space Makan. There is a mosque nearby with bullet holes in the façade and roof: remaining traces of the struggle for political control carried out from 1967 to 1971 between the government of Jordan and the Black September guerilla group.

Materials and Preparation — Whitewash. Black Pigment. A tall ladder. Paint roller. Long brush and aluminum rod.

Procedure - X, Y, and Fawzy Emrany paint the entire façade of the house white. Then they paint the letters **NOMEMBER** in black. The public is invited to watch the action from the balcony of the artspace Makan.

Results — Between noon and 8 pm, the Amman art scene gathers on the balcony of Makan, along with coincidental art space visitors and neighbours. The urban development of Amman is discussed and anecdotes are told over alcohol-free beverages. Anees, an Amman artist who became a friend, is upset by the painting over of the beautiful old stones.
